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### **CHAPTER 1**

#### **Village Government and Elections**

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#### **SEC. 2-1-1 VILLAGE GOVERNMENT.**

The Village of Marshall is a body corporate and politic with the powers of a municipality at common law and governed by the provisions of Chapters 61 and 66 of the Wisconsin Statutes, laws amending those chapters, other acts of the legislature and the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin.

#### **SEC. 2-1-2 ELECTION POLL HOURS.**

The voting polls in the Village of Marshall, Dane County, Wisconsin shall be opened from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. for all elections.

#### **SEC. 2-1-3 OFFICIAL NEWSPAPER.**

The official Village newspaper shall be the Courier, to be used for the publication of legal and/or official notices and documents when publication is used instead of posting as allowed by Wisconsin law.

#### **SEC. 2-1-4 ELECTION OFFICIALS.**

- (a) Pursuant to the Wisconsin Statutes Chapters 5 through 12, there is hereby-established one (1) set of election officials to conduct elections in the wards of the Village, which shall consist of a seven (7) election inspectors. The Clerk-Treasurer shall determine in advance of each election whether the number of election officials for such election should be reduced from the number prescribed by the Wisconsin Statutes, and if such a reduction is so determined, the Clerk-Treasurer shall further redistribute duties among the remaining officials. The Village Clerk-Treasurer shall have the power to limit the number of election officials to not less than three (3). Additional election officials, alternate election officials, two or more sets of election officials to work at different times on election day and special registration deputies may be appointed by the Village Clerk or his/her designee in accordance to Wisconsin State Statutes.
- (b) Election officials shall be appointed and perform their duties in accordance with applicable Wisconsin Statutes.

**SEC. 2-1-5 NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE VILLAGE OFFICE.**

- (a) All candidates for elective Village office in the Village of Marshall shall be nominated by a nonpartisan primary, under Sec. 8.05(5), Wis. Stats.
- (b) Nomination papers shall be signed by not less than twenty (20) not more than one hundred (100) electors of the Village of Marshall. The papers shall be circulated not sooner than December 1 preceding the election and shall be filed with the Village Clerk-Treasurer not later than on the first Tuesday in January or the next day if Tuesday is a holiday.
- (c) No additional candidates may be nominated, by caucus or otherwise, except as above provided.
- (d) Notice to the nonpartisan primary shall be given by the Village Clerk-Treasurer in accordance with Wisconsin Statutes.

**SEC. 2-1-6 WARDS AND POLLING PLACES. (rev. 9/11/01, Ord. 2001-09)**

- (a) **Purpose.**
- (1) Section 5.15, Wis. Stats. requires all cities, villages and towns with a population of one thousand (1,000) or more to establish municipal wards based on the results of the 2000 census. Section 59.03(3)(6), Wis. Stats. requires that each county board adopt and transmit to each municipal governing body in the county a tentative county supervisory district plan, dividing the county into districts and designating the approximate location and population of each ward proposed to effectuate the division of the county into districts. These laws require that each municipality designate by consecutive whole number, geographical description and population, the various wards to be created within the municipality.

(b) **Adoption of Wards.** The Village of Marshall adopts the wards described as follows:

(1) Ward 1. Population 534. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street.

A portion of the Village bordering to the South of the centerline of Main Street (State Road 19) from the School Street/Main Street intersection to the most Eastern Village limits, and all the area lying East of the centerline of School Street from Main Street to Madison Street, and all areas lying South of the centerline of Madison Street (County Hwy. T) from School Street to the most western boundary of the village limits to the most Southern Village limits.

Further described as census tracts: 1076, 1086, 1087, 1088, 1089, 1090, 1091, 3006, 3007, 3008, 3009, 3010, 3011, 3012, 3013, 3014, 3015, 3016.

(2) Ward 2. Population 615. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street

A portion of the Village bordering to the South of the centerline of Main Street (State Road 19) from School Street/Main Street Intersection to the most western boundary of the Village limits; and all lands lying to the North of the centerline of Madison Street (County Hwy T) from the School Street/Madison Street intersection to the most western boundary of the Village limits.

Further described as census tracts: 1077, 1078, 1079, 1080, 1082, 1083, 1084, and 1085.

(3) Ward 3. Population 398. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street.

A portion of the Village bordering to the North of the centerline of Main Street (State Road 19) from the Hubbell Street/Main intersection West to the most Western Village limits by Riley-Deppe Park and the areas lying South of the most Northern border of the Maunasha River and West of Hubbell Street (State Road 73 N.).

Further described as census tracts: 1069, 1070, 1071, 1072, 1073, 1074, 1075, 1997 and 1999.

(4) Ward 4. Population 762. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street

A portion of the Village bordering to the West of the centerline of Hubbell Street (State Road 73 N.) from the most Northern boundary of the Maunasha River to the Railroad tracks, to include all areas lying South of the Railroad Tracks to the Northern boundary of the Maunasha River; and to further include a portion of the Village to the North of the Railroad tracks known as Langer Park.

Further described as census tracts: 1046, 1065, and 1996

(5) Ward 5. Population 327. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street.

A portion of the Village lying North of the Railroad tracks to the most Northern Village limits, with the exception of Langer Park, which is in Ward four (4).

Further described as census tracts: 1044, 2021, 2022, 2023, 2024, and 2042.

- (6) Ward 6. Population 796. Polling Place: 130 S. Pardee Street.

A portion of the Village lying East of the centerline of Hubbell Street to the most Western boundary of the Amerricka's Dream Subdivision, to include all areas lying South of the Railroad tracks and North of the centerline of Main Street (State Road 19).

Further described as census tracts: 2034, 2035, 2037, 2038, 2039, 2040, 2041, 2043, 2044, 2045, 2046, 2047, 2048, 2054, and 2058.

- (7) Ward 7. Population 3. Polling Place: 130 S Pardee Street.

A portion of the Village lying East of Amerricka's Dream subdivision to the most Eastern Village limits, to include all areas lying in the Southwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 11, part of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$ , part of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northwest  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 14, and part of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the Northeast  $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 15, T08N, R12E.

- (c) **Combined Wards.** All Wards created above are hereby combined for voting purposes, so as to share the common polling place indicated, and such combined wards shall use common ballot boxes and ballots or voting machines and separate returns shall not be maintained for the combined wards at any election, except where separate ballots are required under Sections 5.58 to 5.64, Wis. Statutes.
