

## ORDINANCE 2022-02

### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 10, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 27 AND TITLE 13, CHAPTER 1, SECTION 92 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF MARSHALL, DANE COUNTY, WISCONSIN.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Village Board of the Village of Marshall, Dane County, Wisconsin, does hereby ordain as follows:

**Title 10, Chapter 1, Section 27 of the Village of Marshall Code shall be and hereby amended as follows:**

#### TITLE 10

#### **SEC. 10-1-27 SNOW SEASON PARKING REGULATIONS.** *(Rev. 12/95', Ord. 1995-12)(Rev. 01/22', Ord. 2022-02)*

- (a) **Parking Prohibited.** There shall be no parking on:
- (1) Main Street (also known as State Highway 19) in its entirety within the corporate limits.
  - (2) Deerfield Road and Hubbell Street (also known as State Highway 73), in their entirety within the corporate limits, in the Village between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 15th through March 31st.
- (b) **Alternate Side Streets.** All other side streets within the Village shall be regulated between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from November 15th through March 31st as follows:
- (1) On even calendar dates parking shall be on the side of the street where house numbers are even.
  - (2) On odd calendar dates parking shall be on the side of the street where house numbers are odd.
- (c) **Snow Emergency Declarations.**
- (1) The Village Board hereby declares that a snow emergency exists in the Village whenever a snowfall during any period of twenty-four (24) hours or less reaches a depth of three (3) inches or more. Such emergency is declared to be a serious public hazard impairing transportation and public health, safety and welfare for a period of forty-eight (48) hours or until such time as snow removal operations have been declared completed by the Director of Public Works or his designee.
  - (2) The Director of Public Works, or his designee, is hereby authorized to declare a snow emergency watch in advance of the conditions established in Subsection (c)(1) by reason of forecasted heavy snow or blizzard, and all provisions of a snow emergency are to become effective immediately upon the declaration of a snow emergency watch and at such time as the conditions of the snow emergency established above exist, or as otherwise proclaimed in the snow emergency watch declaration.
  - (3) When a Snow Emergency is declared, residents may park on their own yard for the extent of time in which the snow emergency is declared. Once the snow emergency order has expired, residents must park their vehicles in accordance to sections 13-1-92 and 10-1-27(c)(1) and 10-1-27(c)(2) of the Marshall Municipal Code.
- (d) **Parking Restrictions.**
- (1) When signs have been erected at or reasonably near the corporate limits, as provided in Sec. 349.13, Wis. Stats., no owner or operator of any motor vehicle shall park upon any public street or alley:
    - a. During a snow emergency declared in accordance with Subsection (c), until the street or alley has been plowed; or
    - b. Until the snow emergency declaration has been cancelled.

- (2) Pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 66.325, Wis. Stats., the Director of Public Works is authorized to order the erection of temporary "No Parking" signs at any time during the existence of any emergency which impairs or prevents the full, safe use of the highway, street, alley or parking lot.
- (3) It is the declared intent of the Public Works Department to clear the snow from the public parking lots following the completion of snow removal operations on adjacent streets or alleys. The Director of Public Works is authorized, pursuant to Subsection (d)(2) above, to order the temporary posting of one-half (1/2) of each parking lot for the clearing of snow from that half of the parking lot, to be followed by the posting and clearing of the remaining half of the parking lot.
- (4) No person shall park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle upon the streets or any portion of the streets of any posted emergency snow route, as designated in Subsection (a) above, during the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., from November 15th through March 31st, inclusive.
- (5) Any vehicle parked in violation of any provision of this Section shall be ticketed by the Police Department as an illegally parked vehicle and subject to the provision of Section 10-1-32 (Removal of Illegally Parked Vehicles) of this Code of Ordinances.

## TITLE 13

### **SEC. 13-1-92      PARKING REQUIREMENTS.** *(Rev 01/22', Ord 2022-02)*

All new parking lots and all alterations of existing lots shall be subject to the approval of the Village Board, after a recommendation from the Plan Commission. Requests for said parking lots shall be accompanied with detailed plans on landscaping, parking layout, drainage provisions and driveway locations. In all districts, except those areas which are located in a fire district as designated on the official map, there shall be provided at the time any use or building is erected, enlarged, extended, or increased off-street parking stalls for all vehicles in accordance with the following:

- (a) **Access.** Adequate access to a public street shall be provided for each parking space.
- (b) **Design Standards.** Each required off-street parking space shall have a stall width of at least nine (9) feet and a stall length of at least eighteen (18) feet. Such space shall have a vertical clearance of at least six and one-half (6½) feet. Minimum width of aisles providing access to stalls for one-way traffic shall be as follows: Aisles shall be not less than twenty-four (24) feet wide for ninety (90) degree parking, eighteen (18) feet wide for sixty (60) degree parking, fifteen (15) feet wide for forty-five (45) degree parking (angle shall be measured between centerline of parking space and centerline of aisle), and twelve (12) feet wide for parallel parking. For parallel parking, the minimum length of the parking space shall be increased to twenty-three (23) feet. No parking area of more than two (2) spaces shall be designed as to require any vehicle to back into, a public street. Any parking area of more than five (5) spaces shall be sufficiently screened in the form of a solid fence or shrubbery to protect adjacent residential uses. Large expanses of unchanneled parking areas shall be avoided by interior landscaping and safety islands.
- (c) **Location.**
  - (1) The location of parking areas shall be on the same lot as the principal use or not over four hundred (400) feet from the principal use.
  - (2) Off-street parking may be permitted in all yards of all districts, but shall not be closer than five (5) feet to a side lot line, right-of-way line or rear lot line. Exceptions include the following:

- a. District restrictions as stated in Article C;
- b. With exception to Section 10-1-27(c)(3). Parking areas shall be prohibited in the front yards of all residential districts (not including the driveway. Driveways may also be located closer than five (5) feet to a side lot line providing the driveway conforms to the requirements in Section 13-1-93.).


